## Our science topics for this half term

This term, Year 5's science lessons will be about forces! We will be learning about different forces and experimenting to see the effect of these.

Year 6 will be working with Mr. Turnbull and will begin by investigating light, including reflection and refraction.

Children will be developing the science skills by working scientifically to conduct a range of investigations, drawing conclusions and by working with accuracy and precision to draw detailed diagrams of their investigations.

### Our class text

'Every adventure requires a first step...'

After a tumble down the rabbit hole, Alice finds herself far away from home in the absurd world of Wonderland. As mind-bending as it is delightful, Lewis Carroll's 1865 novel is pure magic for young and old alike!

We have been using this story as a basis for our setting descriptions and diary entry writing.
